Major Astor would become MP for Dover in 1922, for 23 years, and owner of The Times newspaper. He was an Olympic gold medallist, winning the Rackets doubles in 1908. During World War One he lost a leg and later became a Lieutenant-Colone He would become Baron Astor of Hever in 1958.

Lady Violef Astor was the daughter of Glibert Ellich-Murray-Kryymmound, 4th Earl of Minto, Viceroy and Governor-General of India and Governor-General of Canada. Her first husband, Lord Charles Petly-Filtzmaurice, was killed in action on 30th Octotor 1914 in World War I. She was awarded the Venerable Order of St John for her worldwide mission.
